(action verb, past tense) (a liquid)

Everybody agreed with this, so they sent a man named \_\_\_\_\_ along with Paul and  
(a word starting with "S")

Barnabas, and wrote down their decision in a \_\_\_\_\_ for all the Christians to read.  
(noun)

Some time later, Paul told Barnabas that they should go back to the \_\_\_\_\_ they had  
(noun, plural)

visited where they had preached about \_\_\_\_\_.  
(a person)

Barnabas wanted to take John \_\_\_\_\_ with them, but Paul didn't want to, because he  
(word starting with "M")

had \_\_\_\_\_ them on their first trip.  
(action verb, something you can do to someone else, past tense)

They disagreed about this, so they went different ways with different people.

Barnabas went to the \_\_\_\_\_ of Cyprus with John ["M" name from above] and Paul  
(noun)

took ["S" name from above] and went back to visit the \_\_\_\_\_  
(noun, plural)

he had started on his first journey.
