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THE RESURRECTION STORY FROM LUKE 24 (NIV): find the underlined words in the word search above (Jesus is in there 7 times)

On the <u>first</u> day of the <u>week</u>, very early in the <u>morning</u>, the <u>women</u> took the <u>spices</u> they had <u>prepared</u> and went to the <u>tomb</u>. They found the <u>stone rolled</u> away from the tomb, but when they <u>entered</u>, they did not find the <u>body</u> of the <u>Lord Jesus</u>. While they were <u>wondering</u> about this, suddenly <u>two</u> men in <u>clothes</u> that <u>gleamed</u> like lightning stood <u>beside</u> them. In their <u>fright</u> the women <u>bowed</u> down with their <u>faces</u> to the <u>ground</u>, but the men said to them, <u>"Why</u> do you look for the <u>living</u> among the <u>dead</u>? He is not <u>here</u>; he has <u>risen!</u> <u>Remember</u> how he told you, while he was <u>still</u> with you in <u>Galilee</u>: 'The <u>Son</u> of Man must be <u>delivered</u> over to the <u>hands</u> of <u>sinners</u>, be <u>crucified</u> and on the <u>third</u> day be <u>raised</u> again.' "Then they remembered his <u>words</u>. When they came <u>back</u> from the tomb, they <u>told</u> all these <u>things</u> to the <u>Eleven</u> and to all the <u>others</u>. It was Mary <u>Magdalene</u>, <u>Joanna</u>, <u>Mary</u> the <u>mother</u> of <u>James</u>, and the others with them who told this to the <u>apostles</u>. But they did not <u>believe</u> the women, <u>because</u> their words <u>seemed</u> to them like <u>nonsense</u>. <u>Peter</u>, <u>however</u>, got up and <u>ran</u> to the tomb. <u>Bending</u> over, he saw the <u>strips</u> of <u>linen lying</u> by themselves, and he went away, wondering to himself what had happened.

Now that <u>same</u> day two of them were going to a <u>village</u> called <u>Emmaus</u>, about <u>seven miles</u> from <u>Jerusalem</u>. They were <u>talking</u> with each other about <u>everything</u> that had happened. As they <u>talked</u> and <u>discussed</u> these things with each other, <u>Jesus himself</u> came up and <u>walked</u> along with them; but they were <u>kept</u> from <u>recognizing</u> him. He asked them, <u>"What</u> are you <u>discussing together</u> as you walk along?"

They stood still, their faces <u>downcast</u>. One of them, <u>named Cleopas</u>, <u>asked</u> him, "Are you the <u>only</u> one <u>visiting</u> Jerusalem who does not <u>know</u> the things that have happened <u>there</u> in these days?" "What things?" he asked. "<u>About Jesus</u> of <u>Nazareth</u>," they <u>replied</u>. "He was a <u>prophet</u>, <u>powerful</u> in word and <u>deed</u> before <u>God</u> and all the <u>people</u>. The <u>chief priests</u> and our <u>rulers handed</u> him <u>over</u> to be <u>sentenced</u> to <u>death</u>, and they crucified him; but we had <u>hoped</u> that he was the one who was going to <u>redeem Israel</u>. And what is <u>more</u>, it is the <u>third</u> day since all this <u>took place</u>. In <u>addition</u>, some of our women <u>amazed</u> us. They went to the tomb <u>early</u> this morning but didn't <u>find</u> his body. They <u>came</u> and told us that they had seen a <u>vision</u> of <u>angels</u>, who said he was <u>alive</u>. Then <u>some</u> of our <u>companions</u> went to the tomb and <u>found</u> it just as the women had said, but they did not see <u>Jesus</u>."

He <u>said</u> to them, "How <u>foolish</u> you are, and how <u>slow</u> to believe all that the prophets have <u>spoken</u>! Did not the <u>Messiah</u> have to <u>suffer</u> these things and then enter his <u>glory</u>?" And <u>beginning</u> with <u>Moses</u> and all the Prophets, he <u>explained</u> to them what was said in all the <u>Scriptures concerning</u> himself. As they <u>approached</u> the village to which they were going, <u>Jesus continued</u> on as if he were going <u>farther</u>. But they <u>urged</u> him <u>strongly</u>, "<u>Stay</u> with us, for it is <u>nearly evening</u>; the day is <u>almost</u> over." So he went in to stay with them. <u>When</u> he was at the <u>table</u> with them, he took <u>bread</u>, gave <u>thanks</u>, <u>broke</u> it and <u>began</u> to <u>give</u> it to them. Then their <u>eyes</u> were <u>opened</u> and they <u>recognized</u> him, and he <u>disappeared</u> from their <u>sight</u>. They asked each other, "Were not our <u>hearts burning within</u> us while he talked with us on the <u>road</u> and opened the Scriptures to us?"

They got up and <u>returned</u> at <u>once</u> to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, <u>assembled</u> together and <u>saying</u>, "It is <u>true</u>! The Lord has risen and has <u>appeared</u> to <u>Simon</u>." Then the two told what had happened on the <u>way</u>, and how <u>Jesus</u> was recognized by them when he broke the bread. While they were still talking about this, <u>Jesus</u> himself stood <u>among</u> them and said to them, "<u>Peace</u> be with you." They were <u>startled</u> and frightened, <u>thinking</u> they saw a <u>ghost</u>. He said to them, "Why are you <u>troubled</u>, and why do <u>doubts</u> rise in your <u>minds</u>? Look at my hands and my <u>feet</u>. It is I <u>myself</u>! <u>Touch</u> me and see; a ghost does not have <u>flesh</u> and <u>bones</u>, as you see I have." When he had said this, he <u>showed</u> them his hands and feet. And <u>while</u> they still did not believe it because of joy and <u>amazement</u>, he asked them, "Do you have <u>anything</u> here to <u>eat</u>?" They gave him a <u>piece</u> of <u>broiled</u> fish, and he took it and ate it in their <u>presence</u>.

He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything <u>must</u> be <u>fulfilled</u> that is <u>written</u> about me in the <u>Law</u> of <u>Moses</u>, the Prophets and the <u>Psalms</u>." Then he opened their minds so they could <u>understand</u> the Scriptures. He told them, "This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and <u>repentance</u> for the <u>forgiveness</u> of <u>sins</u> will be <u>preached</u> in his name to all <u>nations</u>, beginning at Jerusalem. You are <u>witnesses</u> of these things. I am going to <u>send</u> you what my <u>Father</u> has <u>promised</u>; but <u>stay</u> in the <u>city</u> until you have been <u>clothed</u> with <u>power</u> from on <u>high</u>."

When he had led them out to the <u>vicinity</u> of <u>Bethany</u>, he <u>lifted</u> up his hands and <u>blessed</u> them. While he was <u>blessing</u> them, he <u>left</u> them and was <u>taken</u> up into <u>heaven</u>. Then they <u>worshiped</u> him and returned to Jerusalem with <u>great</u> joy. And they <u>stayed</u> <u>continually</u> at the <u>temple</u>, <u>praising</u> God.
